Ignorance of the law is not a defense.

The laws related to owning, possessing, transferring, and transporting firearms is not easy.

Currently, the only source most people have available to them, are well meaning gun shop employees, and questionable internet sources.

The truth is that there is no substitute to learning the actual law from a trained attorney. We are not going to pretend that these laws

make logical sense, but they are the law nonetheless. If you are going to own, possess, or carry a firearm, you must know the laws associated with your conduct.

Most gun owners who run afoul of the law, do so because they did not fully understand the technical rules associated with their firearms use.

This class is appropriate for both beginners and experienced gun owners.

This class is specific to Washington law, so students should be aware that if they travel to other states, there may be vastly different rules for firearms.

The companion class is Personal Protection Law, which is a Level 2 class. This class is not necessarily a pre-requisite to that class, however, without taking both classes, you will not be adequately prepared for safe and responsible concealed carry for armed citizens.

Pre-requisites:

There are no classroom or skill prerequisites for this class.

All Norpoint Training Center courses require that the student be at least 18 years of age, have a clean criminal history and not otherwise be prohibited from the possession of firearms.

Course Requirements/Equipment.

There will be no formal lunch break in this class. There will be an opportunity to eat and drink throughout the class.

There are no formal equipment requirements for this class.

Students are encouraged to bring the following:

A pen and notebook for notetaking.

A pillow or cushion to make sitting at a desk more

comfortable for several hours.

Students who have a concealed pistol license may arrive to the class armed, however, their firearms must remain in their holsters throughout the class.

Absolutely no handling of guns or weapons by students is allowed in the class. In fact, students are encouraged to avoid even showing holstered firearms to other students.

There will be several breaks throughout the class, however students may feel free to use the restrooms at any time during the class.

Students are encouraged to bring food and refreshments to keep themselves comfortable for several hours of classroom lecture.
