Be prepared to survive the aftermath.

Being prepared to survive a violent encounter requires you know both how to respond and when to respond. Traditional firearms training teaches you the "how", but not the "when". Trusting to good judgment in the heat of the moment is simply a recipe for disaster.

Police officers are trained to know the rules regarding the use of force **before** being given the responsibility of carrying a firearm in public. Armed citizens have the same moral and legal responsibility to know the law and should be prepared to articulate why they chose the course of action that they undertook.

In this class you will be exposed to case studies of armed citizens who made honest but fatal errors in judgment. We will teach you the law and how those laws apply to the dynamics of deadly force situations.

You will learn: how the legal

system works, how self-defense is viewed in Washington State, the laws of deadly force, the laws of less than lethal force, and the laws related to the use of Pepper Spray.

The companion class is Firearms Law, which is a Level 1 class. This class is not a pre-requisite to that class, however, without taking both classes, you will not be adequately prepared for safe and responsible concealed carry for armed citizens.

Pre-requisites:

There are no classroom or skill prerequisites for this class.

All Norpoint Training Center courses require that the student be at least 18 years of age, have a clean criminal history and not otherwise be prohibited from the possession of firearms.

Course Requirements/Equipment.

There will be no formal lunch break in this class. There will be an opportunity to eat and drink throughout the class.

There are no formal equipment requirements for this class.

Students are encouraged to bring the following:

A pen and notebook for notetaking.

A pillow or cushion to make sitting at a desk more

comfortable for several hours.

Students who have a concealed pistol license may arrive to the class armed, however, their firearms must remain in their holsters throughout the class.

Absolutely no handling of guns or weapons by students is allowed in the class. In fact, students are encouraged to avoid even showing holstered firearms to other students.

There will be several breaks throughout the class, however students may feel free to use the restrooms at any time during the class.

Students are encouraged to bring food and refreshments to keep themselves comfortable for several hours of classroom lecture.
